Firenock v2.0s

The first time I heard of the lighted nock idea, I thought it was a joke and why would you need it. I went on with my every day shooting, hunting and losing of arrows in the woods. I purchased a new set of arrows that included one free lighted nock, I put it in my arrow and saw what it could do. I shot it for a while and even hunted with it. The problem is, the first shot I took with it at an animal made me not want to try any others. It hit the animal and shut off. So, the next hunting season I was back to my old ways.

Then, I read a review on the Firenock and it sounded like something that might work a little better than the other system I tried. Just recently I purchased the Firenock v2.0s, man is this system nice. I knew from the packaging that it came in that some time was put in to these nocks. The package I purchased came with 3 lighted nocks, and three that are weighted the same for practice. I read the directions and put them all together, which took all of just a few minutes. Not only did they fit perfectly in my shafts, they are probably the closest in tolerance compared to the stock nocks.

Next was the magnet, this was the part that I was kind of unsure about. It just did not seem like it would work that well. Well I was proven very wrong. I put the magnet just in front of my drop away rest, on the shelf of the bow. I knocked an arrow and let it fly, sure enough the nock lit up just like it was supposed to. I shot all 3 of the nocks to make sure they all work, and every one of them was perfect for multiple shots. Then like in the directions, just a fast swipe over the magnet

again and they shut off. At that point I was very happy with my purchase, and ready to really test one of them.

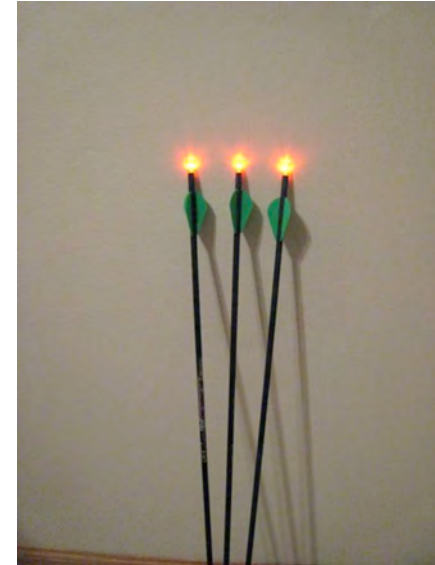
I took an old arrow and slipped a nock in, went out to my shooting range. I had a brick in one hand and my bow in the other. I stepped back to 20 yards and let the arrow fly; the nock turned on like always and hit the brick. To my surprise the nock never shut off, so I was sold. Now the arrow on the other hand, it was definitely not being used anymore. This hunting season I will have a new nock in my quiver, and I will have no worries this time.

This system is very solid and top quality. If you are looking for a new lighted nock system, this would be a great way to go. They are very bright, and easy to use. The brick test I performed is a great example of how strong they are, and how well they will work in the woods or for whatever use you want them for. If you are in the market, take a good look at the Firenocks!
