*Firenock v2.0s*

I have always made my own lighted nocks using Thill bobber lights. They worked really well for me and I enjoyed making them. However, this year I was unable to find the lights in stores and I was getting more and more nervous as the season got closer. I did a quick internet search and started reading reviews about the Firenock. It seemed like a great idea, but I thought they were too expensive at first (remember, I was making my own the cheap way!). I finally bit the bullet and bought some to try out.

First, it was way easier to set up and use this system. No drills, glue, or wooden dowels were needed to make this thing work. It was also nice to have practice nocks because I had sometimes destroyed my homemade jobs during practice rounds. And talk about easy to use....I was amazed at how quickly they lit up, and how easy

it was to turn them off. I used to have to pull the nock out and then pull the battery until the light went out. Now, just a simple pass by the magnet and I was good. My wife even commented that I should have bought these years ago!

The only problem I had with the whole system was that I had the magnet installed on my Whisker Biscuit using the bracket. For some reason (probably user error), I lost the bracket and magnet during my first trek into the woods. I can't tell you how disappointed I was when I got to my tree stand. I backtracked to look for it and never found it. I have yet to order another, but I will as soon as I can. Obviously the nocks are useless without that part of the system.

Since my purchase, at least two more of my friends have tried the Firenocks and

they are also sold on them. I look forward to a successful season, and can't wait to see a Firenock fly at something brown!!
