

Firenock review by Travis Carden, September 12, 2007
Firenock v2.0s

It did not take long to realize that the Firenocks were the lighted nock for me. After trying multiple others with failures, I concluded that a lighted nock was a must....as was one that did not fail. I called and spoke with Dorge after reading a few reviews on the Firenocks. He walked me through the setup procedure, and the design of the nocks. We went page by page through the Firenock website as I learned about the various designs and options for different magnet mounts.

When I received my first package of the Firenocks, it took less than a minutes to assemble them and get the magnet attached to my riser. I shoot a dropaway, and used the

thicker magnet and no attachments were needed. A friend was over shooting that evening and we were both initially impressed....time would tell if they would be dependable.

I have shot these nocks now for a couple of months and have yet to have a failure. I was shooting into my 3D target one night and glanced off of a Firenock with another arrow, which did two things:

- 1) It broke the nock section of the Firenock and
- 2) It shoved the magnet / circuit board assembly about halfway down inside my arrow shaft.

I passed the entire arrow by the magnet and the light

went off, and unscrewed my tip and pushed the assembly out of the end. I replaced the plastic nock end and it is still shooting great.

To wrap it up, I have to say I am very pleased with the functionality of the Firenocks. I, in fact ordered two more packs to make sure my quiver would be full this season. I intend on doing some filming and the last thing I want is a lighted nock, not to light.
