

*Firenock Review by Donald W. Gabbert, October 1, 2007*  
*Firenock v2.0s*

I would like to start out by saying I have never used any of the lighted nocks prior to buying this set of Firenocks. The archer at my bow shop suggested the Firenock because of some of the problems that can be encountered with another brand they carried. In saying this I really have not used any other product in which to compare the Firenock to.

HOWEVER, I wish I would have had these nocks a long time ago. I wouldn't have lost SO many arrows and it may have aided in tracking my deer in the evening hours. They work absolutely flawlessly! I have shot the practice tips and the lighted tips about 100 times. Not 1 failure. The nocks seem to be of a higher grade, with a tighter tolerance than the cheaper generic nocks.

I am shooting an Iron Mace bow, QAD Ultra Pro HD rest, Viper sights. Set up was very easy. The components fit like you would expect "high end aftermarket parts" to fit on a wheeler (to use an analogy). I will

be using them for the first time in the field in the a.m., weather permitting. If you want to have some fun, shoot the Firenock at a 40 yard target at dusk. The family thought it was SO cool.

I must say that I have not used this product for a long time, and time will only tell how well this product will hold up, but from what I can tell it definitely should be on your buy list. It seems to be of high quality. This was evident when I nocked an arrow and lock up my rest (which is <90 degrees), and I am set at a tad nock high at full draw, the arrow barely sits on the rest. At full draw the rest pops up to 90 degrees and it seems as if only a few grains of the arrow is setting on the rest, say about 20 grains. In short, the nock fits my winners choice string so perfectly it squares my arrow up. It makes the generic nocks seem like sloppy cheap throwaways. I hope one can understand what I am trying to describe.

I plan on putting this product on all of my arrows.

Now for my suggestions. They are few. First, I think they need to have a diagram that shows the magnet position in relation to the arrow at full draw. The 11/16th and 3/4 inch stuff seems a bit confusing in trying to put on a sticker with a tape measure. I placed mine on a plane center parallel with my arrow. It works flawlessly. I was unaware at the time that they have excellent pictures on their web site for magnet placement on most arrow rests.

Secondly, I wish my retailer had packages of practice nocks to buy for my other arrows. They are available for purchase online.

And lastly, The only thing that I can think of to make this product any better is to package a 190 B&C buck with every set.
